# Background

- Only 6% of adverse drug reactions (ADR) are reported<sup>1</sup>
- ADR data supports Health Canada by strengthening its knowledge base on product safety in the interest of improving patient outcomes and public health: in product regulation, advisories and safer medication use for Canadians
- Health Canada defines an ADR as a noxious and unintended effect to a health product<sup>3</sup>
- Health products are prescription medications, over the counter treatments, natural products and vaccines<sup>3</sup>
- Section 12(7) of the British Columbia Health Professions Act Bylaws Schedule F, Part 1

*"If an ADR as defined by Health Canada is identified, the full"* pharmacist must notify the patient's practitioner, make an appropriate entry on the PharmaNet record and report the reaction to the appropriate department of Health Canada<sup>75</sup>

Telehealth pharmacists are uniquely positioned to recognize and report ADRs

# Study

### **Primary Objective**:

To determine the number of ADR reports electronically submitted to Health Canada by the British Columbia (BC) telehealth pharmacist team for the years 2015 to 2017

### Secondary Objectives:

- 1. Determine the proportion of BC telepharmacist ADR reports to:
- i) All BC pharmacists
- ii) All Canadian Pharmacists

2. Describe barriers to telehealth pharmacist ADR reporting


## Action

- Northwest Telepharmacy Solutions (NTS) BC telehealth pharmacists underwent training with Canada Vigilance BC Regional Office in 2013
- BC Telehealth pharmacists (18) identified ADRs while providing consultations via the Health Advice line 1700H to 0900H 365 days of the year. ADRs were reported via Health Canada website
- Data collected: pharmacist name, date of report, suspected drug, ADR, and an identifier code for all corresponding call documentation
- Excel spreadsheets were used for data collection and analysis.
- Canada Vigilance BC provided Canadian and Provincial ADR reporting data
- In 2018, the telehealth pharmacist team completed a brief anonymous on-line survey regarding factors that may be barriers to ADR reporting


5% of NTS BC Telehealth Pharmacists report ADRs routinely

### Figure 1: Proportion of ADRs Reported By Pharmacists in Canada







Figure 2: Proportion of ADRs Reported By Pharmacists in British Columbia (BC)
